Vertebroplasty: A Comprehensive Overview and Hands-On Cadaver Workshop

outline the epidemiology, anatomy and physiology of vertebral compression fractures; interpret imaging techniques; select patients appropriate for the procedure; discuss the procedure; avoid complications; prepare cement; and work to become credentialed for the procedure.

Regenerative Injection Therapy Cadaver Workshop

physically examine patients to diagnose chronic, painful conditions of the occipital, cervical, thoracic, lumbar, and pelvic areas; inject these areas with various techniques.

Legal Side of Pain Workshop

develop and implement compliance programs related to pain management; use controlled substances to treat pain without fear of breaking the law; employ office-based techniques for the treatment of addictions.

Review of Gross Anatomy in Relation to Pain

review the new developments and old postulates in clinical anatomy which affect the diagnosis and treatment of axial pain.

Evolution of the Field of Pain Medicine

recite historical developments in the field of pain medicine; define issues such as pain/acute pain, chronic pain/pain specialist; differentiate between acute and chronic pain; clinically compare disease and illness; utilize various models in evaluation and management of chronic pain.

Spinal Cord Stimulation: Good, Better, Best

outline the history of spinal cord stimulation and the changes in battery technology; utilize advanced programming capabilities and volt technology; differentiate corrosive vs noncorrosive anodes; discuss how different systems benefit different patients; avoid performing a trial in office.

A New Look at Whiplash

describe the pathophysiology of events in whiplash syndrome; relate tissues injured as pertains to the whole body and not only the cervical spine; discuss a comprehensive treatment approach from an osteopathic perspective; discuss various forms of osteopathic manipulation used in whiplash.

Tumor Coblation with Vertebroplasty

relate the incidence of vertebral fractures associated with metastatic spinal tumors; describe the principles of coblation or plasma radiofrequency; compare and contrast traditional therapies to enhanced vertebroplasty; outline technical aspects of the procedure.

Uncommon Causes of Low Back Pain

review the common causes of low back pain (LBP); list uncommon causes of LBP; describe the pathology and anatomy of the uncommon causes; diagnose uncommon causes by history and physical exam; treat uncommon causes of LBP.

Evidence Based Pain Medicine & ASIPP Guidelines

define evidence based medicine; describe the methodology of those studies and how the data is collected; access sources of evidence based interventional pain medicine including the American Society of Interventional Pain Physicians guidelines; differentiate between diagnostic procedure guidelines and therapeutic procedure guidelines.

Evidence Base for Treatment of Cervical and Low Back Pain

describe the magnitude of the problem; correlate early diagnosis with good recovery; help prevent recurrence; outline surgical and nonsurgical outcomes; search for the pain generator; access the latest treatment literature for cervical and LBP in relationship to oral medications, physical therapy, epidural injection, Zygonophaseal injections, medial branch nerve neurotomy; sacroiliac joint injection, botulinum toxin injection, intradiscal procedures; implantable devices, and multidisciplinary comprehensive inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation programs.

Behavioral Aspects of Pain Management

differentiate pain perception between the sensory discriminative dimension and the affective dimension; list the four components of pain perception; describe various types of psychometric testing; review psychological treatments including but not limited to traditional psychotherapy and cognitive – behavioral therapies; employ interdisciplinary pain and functional restoration programs for better outcomes.

Evidence Based Osteopathic Treatment of the Cervical & Lumbar Spine

discuss various types of manual medicine; evaluate the quality of studies available for manual medicine of the spine; determine the safety and efficacy of the studies; outline the limitations presented by the studies; review future directions and needed research in manual medicine.

Opioids: The Good, The Bad, & The Ugly

discuss the advantages, disadvantages, and potential addiction issues regarding opioid use and misuse.

Disability Evaluation and Rating in the Pain Management Spectrum

outline the history of impairment rating guides; compare and contrast different impairment rating systems including the AMA Guides to the Evaluation of Permanent Impairment 5th Edition and the Florida Uniform Permanent Impairment Rating Schedule; define impairment, disability, and handicap – compare and contrast the benefits and limitations of rating only impairment in these populations; strategize on approaching the impairment rating of a pain patient including review of possible methods of rating pain.
